From director Steve James, *Abacus: Small Enough to Jail* (Academy Award Nominee-Best Documentary Feature), tells the incredible saga of the Chinese immigrant Sung family, owners of Abacus Federal Savings of Chinatown, New York. Accused of mortgage fraud, the indictment and trial forces the Sung family to defend themselves -- and their bank's legacy in the Chinatown community -- over the course of a five-year legal battle. (2017, Documentary, 90 mins. English with Mandarin Subtitles.)



Chanterelle Sung, a member of the Sung family, was a former prosecutor at the New York County District Attorney's Office from 2004 to 2011. After the Abacus trial was over, Chanterelle left her 10.5 year career in public service where she currently works as a director in corporate security and compliance for a pharmaceutical company in New York City.

Ms. Sung and other local panelists will discuss the case and how we can all engage in actions to make sure these injustices do not happen again after the film screening at 1:45 PM.
