What is the Chinatown- International District JamFest?

JamFest is a non-for-profit monthly neighborhood summer music festival taking place in the heart of Seattle's Chinatown-International District. This festival features a variety of live music performances at four venues taking place First Thursdays June through September (June 3, July 1, August 5, September 2). The Wing Luke will serve as one of the venues as well as a check-in point and home base for the event. To visit all four venues, tickets are \$8 general and \$5 for Wing Luke Members, series passes will also be available.

The goal of JamFest is to encourage more visitors to experience the rich culture and businesses of the neighborhood through exciting live entertainment. Not only will we have music performances, but there will also be live art installations/performances in Hing Hay Park.
